

A-C does not involve scoring points.

A

Raise Your Hand to Answer (Simple Method)

Teacher: What is this?

Students raise their hands if they know the answer.

The chosen student answers.

If no one gets it right, move to the next slide.

Note:

Instead of choosing only one student who raises a hand, have all students who want to answer stand up. Let them respond one by one. In a big class, allow only the first ten students who stand. When the tenth student stands, stop and have those ten answer in order.



B

Work in Pairs

Teacher: What is this?

A: Maybe it's a koala.

B: Maybe it's a bear.

If you feel confident, raise your hand.



Only one person in each pair raises a hand. If picked, both stand and say the answer together.

C

Secret-Answer Pair Game (for little kids)

Once you and your partner know the answer,

👉 Put your hand over your mouth 😋

At the end, everyone calls out:

Teacher: 3, 2, 1!

Students: It's a ___!

Teacher: The answer is... a koala!



If you think, "Oh, maybe this is wrong," you can talk with your partner and change your answer.

D

Work with your group to write your answer on the whiteboard.

Look at the three slides, talk together, and write your final answer.

Teacher: 3, 2, 1, show!

Everyone shows their boards.

Each group reads their answer as one voice.

Group 1: It's a koala.

Group 2: It's an elephant.

Group 3: It's a mouse...



E

TV Show–Style Game

◆ Overview

A fun guessing game played in groups

Each group decides the answer order

e.g. clockwise / rock-paper-scissors

4 students → order 1–4

5 students → order 1–5



◆ Rules

One student from each group comes to the front

Whisper the answer to the teacher

It is not a race → no running

One answer per slide

Students must answer in the order decided by the group

📌 Example (4 students):

There are 12 questions

If a group answers correctly on Slide 1 each time,

→ each student answers 3 times total

◆ Points

Correct on Slide 1 → ★★★

Correct on Slide 2 → ★★

Correct on Slide 3 → ★

Incorrect → 0 points

◆ Game Flow

Slide 1

Teacher: Look. What is this?

Group discussion (5–10 seconds)

👉 When ready

→ One student from each group quietly comes forward

They whisper answers in order:

Student 1: It's a bear.

Teacher: No, it isn't. → Student returns to seat

Student 2: It's a koala.

Teacher: Correct! → ★★★ → Student returns

Student 3, Student 4...



- Groups that answered correctly stay quiet and observe.
- Other groups continue on the next slide.

Notes:

- If you prefer not to have everyone share the same megaphone, you can give each student a sheet of paper to roll up and use instead. (Discard the paper after the activity.)
- Because students answer on every slide, all 12 questions may take almost a full class period. To keep the game shorter, you can set a time limit, such as ending the game after about 30 minutes. At around 20 minutes, you can announce, "The next one is the final question."
