
I designed it so kids can keep practicing without getting bored.

- 1. Stroke order check together as a class
- 2. Practice, Maze, Letter recognition done individually
- *The teacher walks around the classroom.
- *Students who finish early can color the illustration.

Coloring the illustration is a filler activity while waiting for everyone to finish

3. If everyone has started on step 4, check the answers together.

Check the answers with a partner or by showing them on the screen.




When we do worksheets, I make sure to look after not just the slower students, but also the ones who finish early.

Step ⑤, the coloring section, is there so early finishers have something to do and don't get bored. For Step ④, "Letter Recognition," I don't wait for everyone to finish. Once most students have started, I say, "Alright, let's check the answers now."

That little prompt usually makes them speed up naturally, and by the time we check together, almost everyone has finished the worksheet.






